

Director's Note

In the heat of the summer of 1899, a revolution took place in New York. During the Spanish American War, newspapers took advantage of higher circulation by raising their prices and charging the newsboys 60¢ per 100 papers instead of the pre-war price of 50¢. After the war, most papers went back to their pre-war pricing... with the exception of The World and The Journal, who decided to leave prices higher. Because of this, on July 18, 1899, newsboys from Long Island City destroyed the wagons of The World and The Journal. The next day, the rest of the city's newsboys followed suit, and for the next few weeks, a group of children held the most powerful men in the city in check. With this quick history lesson, we dive into the world of 1899 and our story.

Although some of the people you'll see on stage were real historical characters, some are an amalgamation of young boys and girls who fought for better wages and treatment... and won. The ideas of 'seizing the day' and making a change for the better, taking on impossible odds, being the underdog, and of course, David and Goliath, have echoed throughout the arts. From Star Wars to Lord of the Rings to The Hunger Games, and right down to the Barbie movie, winning for the common good of the masses over the tyrannical rule of the few has been something we have always admired as a society.

Perhaps that need to have the underdog succeed, to root for the idealistic starry eyed-dreamer resonates with all of us. Through Jack's trial by fire, we see all the doubts in every significant decision we have ever made in our lives. By investing in his journey and our desire to see him succeed, we hope that when we are faced with insurmountable odds, we can endeavor to chase our dreams and take the hard road, steadfast against the wind and storm, knowing that we will be better off on the other side.

This show has been special to me. It has allowed me to bring all of my various theater lives together. I got to immerse myself in a world with young people I have watched grow into adults from Waldwick, Nutley, and Bloomfield. I've also had the chance to work with a new array of incredible talent. I am grateful to have had this unique opportunity and also to see them all bond. I hope you see all of them on this stage in the future.

This cast is among the kindest and most talented I have had the privilege to direct. The crew, art team, set designers and construction team are patient, kind, and accommodating. Together, they have created a rich world for our cast to inhabit. They did all of this not for pay or accolades, but to use their talent to help a stranger... they did it for Justin. If you know someone who has spent their summer participating in this production, be proud of what they have accomplished.

For those of you who drove cast and crew back and forth to rehearsal, got your car washed, built sets, bought an ad, or donated to our organization, we thank you from the bottom of our hearts for helping us create this world.

President's Note

"Now is the time to seize the day. Stare down the odds and seize the day. Once we've begun, if we stand as one, someday becomes somehow."

This lyric from the show is one I feel has truly exemplified this past summer. Newsies tells the story of the 1899 newsboy's strike and how the community of Newsies came together to support one another, taking it upon themselves to answer the call and unite to achieve their goals. These themes of support, unity, and community mirror the purpose of this organization and what this summer has been. This summer we have received more support than we ever could have anticipated. With forty individuals on stage and another forty off-stage of our production team, crew, orchestra, and volunteers, and the support from our audiences and surrounding community we have been able to make this summer something incredibly special.
